## ORDINANCE 1006-01-2022

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### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING , 11-1-2, POSSESSION AND USE OF FIREARMS AND OTHER DANGEROUS WEAPONS, SPECIFIC TO 123 HALE ROAD

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The Village Board of the Village of Neosho, Dodge County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

**SECTION I: (c) Use of Firearms:**

(1) **Regulated.** No person except an authorized police officer shall discharge any firearm or bow, arrow, crossbow as defined in 11-1-2, (a) (1) Firearm, or (2) Other Dangerous Weapon, within the Village or have any firearm in his possession within the Village unless it is unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case or other suitable container, except for the purposes of hunting or hunting activities specific to 123 Hale Road by person possessing valid the hunting license

(d) **Use of other Dangerous Weapons**

(2) **Exceptions.**

B. 123 Hale Road by person possessing valid the hunting license, for the purposes of hunting game birds and animals under licenses issued by the state department of natural resources pursuant to Wis. Stats. §§ 29.573, 29.574.

**SECTION II: PENALTY.**

Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter may be subject to a penalty as provided in Sec. 1-1-6 of this code.

**SECTION III:** This ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and publication.
