Reconsideration, Ordinance 1006-01-2022, Amendment to Ordinance 11-1-2, Possession and Use of Firearms and Other Dangerous Weapons, specific to 123 Hale Road.

The owner of the property approached the Village President that he would annex his property into the Town of Rubicon if he cannot hunt on his property.

Discussion ensued that the land had been hunted in the past without permission. This property owner has asked for permission.

President Oldenhoff researched maps of the area and that the apartments and Village Hall are in close proximity and by DNR regulations needs to be 100 yards from structure.

The Village Hall is 90 yards from property. Apartment building is 70.1 yards from property.

Discuss / Approve Neosho Rubicon Ashippun Police Department Budget

The current year to date Assistant Police Chief Linzenmeyer gave an overview of the Police Department. He reported on the employee history, budget surplus, revenues, squad car fund, court fee, spill man fee, system fee, emergency fund.

The squads are 2014 and 2018. 2014 63,000 and 2018 has 43,000.

Radar Trailer has been utilized and rotated this year. There is a battery charging system that is going bad. May upgrade the lighting to red and blue.

Assistant Chief presented wage comparison information. Employee retainage was reported on. There have been no complaints or lawsuits to date because they are full-time experienced employees. They are going to calls that the other agencies are at a higher wage level.

The emergency fund is available at 4,500.

Discussion ensued that the NRA needs to support Fire Department and to attend calls.

Discussion ensued that there is information of when on duty and dispatch.

Austin Borchardt arrived 6:36 pm.

Discussion ensued of contracting with the Sheriff's Department. Discussion ensued of local control.

Discussion ensued of the contracting not receive the same service, communication, and very costly.

Reeseville just went through and receiving ten hours a week. As costs arise, we would be billed. The Police Chief fields a lot of items that would be to an attorney. Provide very sensitive care.

Neu commented, that he never heard this in Ashippun. Wife is an EMT.

Assistant Chief Linzenmeyer reported that this is unknown.

Motion (Rodriguez/Villwock) to approve an increase of 5% and to come out of the carry over.

Discussion ensued of difference of the increase between patrol and chief.

Motion (Guckenberger/Adkins) to amend to an 1.11 increase per hour for each, including Chiefs, Patrol, and Administrative Staff, and the increase to come from the revenues. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion ensued of a call three weeks ago that an officer went to a call and then the dispatch called him to another call.

Future item is a body cam. Issue is cost and data and they only record what's in front and catches audio.

Motion by Rodriguez, second by Schronenburger to adjourn at 6:59 p.m.
